IRONWORKERS – Work as members of a group that raises and places fabricated structural steel members, such as beams, girders, plates, channels, angles, and columns and unite them permanently to form a completed structure or the framework of a structure. Structural steel work is usually broke down into various phases, such as rigging up hoisting equipment, raising (erecting) steel, connecting, plumbing and aligning, bolting up and welding with separate gangs (raising gang, bolt up gang) performing each phase. The workers are usually, though not always, interchangeable on all phases of the work except welding, which requires a technique or talent not possessed by all workers. Iron grating, roof decking, metal siding, fencing, ornamental ironwork, window sash, curtain wall, reinforcing steel and post tensioning cables in concrete, as well as setting precast concrete, moving heavy construction machinery and equipment, and erecting pre-engineered metal buildings.
